- **Strengthening national support** for expert centres involved in **European Reference Networks (ERNs)**.
- Developing **care pathways and referral systems**.
- Building national networks by creating **tailored, country-specific strategies** for better integration.
- Developing **national programs** for **undiagnosed patients** linked to the ERNs.



Expected outcomes

- **Implementable recommendations, models, and practical solutions** for rare disease and complex conditions management across Europe within hospitals, expert centres, and healthcare systems.
- **Real-world testing and improvement:** Solutions will be tested in real settings, and continuous feedback will help refine and improve healthcare outcomes.
- **Sustainability:** JARDIN aims for **long-term impact**. By 2027, all countries should have a comprehensive integration plan for ERNs, aligned with their national strategy.
